

The information below is provided as a courtesy. Typically, following a street name or address change:

- 1. For residents that have City of Concord utility services, the address change will be reflected on the City of Concord's utility accounts.
- 2. Residents may need to inform the U. S. Postal Service of their new address. The City will inform the Postal Service about the street name change, but residents may also need to inform them. The City does not control any operations of the U. S. Postal Service.
- 3. Residents may need to inform companies and other service providers about their new address.
- 4. Residents would need to inform the Cabarrus County Tax Office about their new address so that the tax records are correct.
- 5. Registered voters may need to inform the Board of Elections of their new address so that the Board of Elections information matches the voter's correct address.
- 6. Residents may need to inform the Division of Motor Vehicles about their new address. See North Carolina General Statute 20-7.1 for additional information. § 20-7.1. Notice of change of address or name.
  - (a) Address. A person whose address changes from the address stated on a drivers license must notify the Division of the change within 60 days after the change occurs. If the person's address changed because the person moved, the person must obtain a duplicate license within that time limit stating the new address. A person who does not move but whose address changes due to governmental action may not be charged with violating this subsection.
